## **The Choreographer**

Dorothy Steane was educated at Fort Street Girls High and graduated from Sydney Teachers College in physical education in 1966. She also studied piano and violin at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music and played in the Sydney Youth Orchestra. TRACTION, her first ballet, toured NSW country towns and was performed at the Orange Festival of the Arts in 1971 before featuring at the Bodenwieser Ballet's end of year performance. In 1972 Dorothy approached Kit Guyatt to film TRACTION as part of her application to study choreography at a New York performing arts university. She won the Ballet Australia Choreographic Seminar scholarship in 1973 and created Slipstream. Her other works are Two Parts of a Whole and Winterscape.

## **The Ballet**

In TRACTION the drama and tension of Bartok's Symphony for Two Pianos and Percussion is interpreted to represent the interaction of social forces. The effect of the pull and resistance of peers and authority figures on personal relationships leaves all people changed as a result. Dorothy says "I hear music and see dance movements and colours." The dancers in TRACTION wear graduations of pink to purple depicting simple to more complex emotions.
